IVOR BURGE WOMEN - JPN 64 def. ACT 56

Japan started the tournament with a thrilling win over the women from the nation's capital, in a tightly contested contest with several lead changes. Maya Senda led all scorers with 25 points but Kim Perry kept ACT in it with 16 points and 18 rebounds with only Japan's ability to get out in transition, scoring 13 points in fast break points, proving the difference.

UNDER-20 WOMEN - ACT 37 def. by NSW 61

ACT jumped out to an early five-point lead with Emma Rowcliffe (11 points, seven rebounds) starring but from then, NSW put on a defensive clinic to notch a convincing victory. They forced the ACT into tough shots and turnovers which created a lot of fast break opportunities, eventually outscoring their opposition 24-2 in fast break points.

IVOR BURGE WOMEN - NSW COUNTRY 108 def. SA 18

NSW Country sent a message to the rest of the competition with an emphatic victory as three players tallied double-doubles while Zora Hines (30 points) and Eliza Mills (34 points) easily outscored their opposition by themselves. Amy Howard was a shining light for SA though and proved they will be competitive with other teams in the tournament.

UNDER-20 MEN - VIC 71 def. by WA 80

Unable to back up from their victory on Day 1, Victoria fell to WA in an upset despite a fourth quarter surge. The Vics led for most of the first half with Sean Macdonald dialling in from three-point range, knocking down four triples. Kyle Bowen sparked a 14-0 run for WA though, finishing with 16 points, ten rebounds and three blocks while Alex Ducas matched the three-point shooting with 15 points as well. Victoria found themselves down by 20 early in the final term before Deng Dut (14 points, two steals) threatened a comeback with WA's inside presence holding them off to secure a big win.

UNDER-20 WOMEN - QLD 77 def. SA 54

In a hard fought battle, Queensland ran away with the win following a strong second half after SA opened up a double-digit lead prior to half-time. Sam Simons scored a team-high 14 points but Qld's dominance on the glass eventually took hold, winning the board battle 61-32 as they turned around the scoreboard as well. Ula Motuga recorded ten points and ten rebounds while Haylee Andrews notched 15 points in the come from behind victory.

IVOR BURGE WOMEN - VIC 86 def. WA 14

Victoria's fast paced style of play proved too much for WA, running the floor effortlessly to tally 30 fast-break points and counter the efforts of Kristy Carter who had ten points and eight boards for WA. Kaitlin Zonneveld was everywhere on the court, producing an amazing stat-line of 22 points, ten boards, seven assists and ten steals.

UNDER-20 MEN - QLD 92 def. TAS 65

After a tightly-contested first half, scores were level at the main break but then Kody Stattmann took over in the second half to finish with 25 points. Lochie Boucher's 18 points off the bench showed off Tasmania's deep roster but Qld's inside presence, courtesy of Samson Froling (16 points, 13 rebounds) answered any challenge.

IVOR BURGE MEN - ACT 47 def. by VIC 110

The defensive pressure of Victoria was obvious from the outset, forcing ACT into 40 turnovers and when they got out in the open court, they seemed unstoppable. Jake De La Motte took full advantage with ten steals to go with a game-high 30 points while Justin Koenig was ACT's best with 11 points and 13 rebounds.

IVOR BURGE MEN - SA 93 def. TAS 67

In a great offensive display, SA kept the scoreboard ticking over via Wayne Kinross who scored 32 points in just 30 minutes of play. They had contributors from all over their roster which helped off of Tasmania who threatened a comeback at times thanks to the efforts of Joshua Cleary (33 points, 22 rebounds).

UNDER-20 MEN - NBA GA 68 def. SA 79

Captain Alex Mudronja provided the hustle the Redbacks needed to get over the line against the Global Academy, collecting 23 points and 11 boards to lead his side in both categories. SA's strength on the offensive glass made it hard for the international opposition to stick with them, despite the best efforts of Francisco Caffaro who tallied 18 points and ten rebounds.

UNDER-20 WOMEN - TAS 37 def. by VIC 100

The Big V's bench chimed in for 43 points as they cracked the century mark with an impressive offensive performance. Madeline Puli led all scorers with 19 points as she starred in Victoria's second unit while Sharna Thompson paced Tasmania with 11 points while shooting 42% from deep.

IVOR BURGE MEN - NSW 112 def. WA 53

NSW's ability to get on the glass and score 30 second chance points overall gave the Sky Blues the edge early and their front court proved the difference with Keelan Crawford scoring 33 points. Captain Shannon McKinley led WA with 27 points and nine boards.

UNDER-20 MEN - ACT 58 def. by NSW 92

The men from the nation's capital fought hard in the first half on the back of big man Glen Morison, who finished with 24 points and 14 rebounds but NSW eventually got the better of them close to the rim, out-scoring ACT 56-26 in the paint. Will Hickey also got their transition game going, adding two steals to his 24 points and eight rebounds.

UNDER-20 WOMEN - WA 60 def. by ACT 67

Neither team could be separated in regulation with the clash going into overtime before ACT finally prevailed. WA trailed for most of the game but came up clutch down the stretch to force the extra period thanks to Courtney Green (13 points, 11 rebounds). ACT stepped up their defence in overtime though, out-scoring WA 10-3 with Isabelle Bourne producing a huge 20-point, 22-rebound performance.

IVOR BURGE WOMEN - ACT 46 def. by NSW COUNTRY 70

Led by Eliza Mills' 20 points and seven rebounds in just 19 minutes of court time, NSW quickly pushed the lead to double figures in the second quarter after ACT took an early lead and from there, they were not headed. Taylor Anderson paced ACT with 16 points and ten boards but their low shooting percentage as a team hurt their chances.

UNDER-20 WOMEN - NSW 60 def. by QLD 69

In a game featuring four WNBL Champions and four members of the Australian Sapphires World Champion team, Qld's efforts on the glass proved to be the difference especially late. Natalia Beaumont scored 15 points to lead NSW and keep them in the contest but Qld's execution down the stretch via Haylee Andrews (15 points, 11 rebounds) and Miela Goodchild's game-high 19 points ensured they finished Day 2 on a high.
