Ivor Burge Men: Victoria 115 def. Tasmania 70

Victoria continued their campaign undefeated with another strong performance as their transition offence proved too much for Tasmania, led by Jake Le La Motte [42 points]. Joshua Cleary did his best to dominate down low, finishing with 18 points and 16 rebounds.

Ivor Burge Women: Victoria 124 def. South Australia 14

The Vic women matched their male counterparts with another big win on the morning of Day 3, shooting 59% from the field and having six players score in double-digits. South Australia's best performer was Amy Howard, who scored a team high of eight points and was 100% from the free throw line.

Ivor Burge Men: ACT 90 def. New South Wales 51

This was a hard fought game and the scoreline did not reflect that by the end of the contest as ACT's teamwork led them to the victory. Jack Littleton had another strong performance with 21 points and 21 rebounds while Justin Koenig added 25 points and 15 boards to counter the Sky Blues' Keelan Crawford [21 points, six rebounds].

Ivor Burge Men: South Australia 159 def. Western Australia 12

Franz Theodore stuffed the stat-sheet for South Australia in their big win, recording 43 points, 13 rebounds, three assists, five steals and three rejections but to WA's credit, they continued to fight out the game until the final siren with their commitment to the cause never wavering.

U20 Women: Victoria 91 def. Western Australia 35

Despite an early lead for WA, Victoria responded quickly through their perimeter shooting which opened up the floor courtesy of Kara Tessari who shot 60% from deep. Chelsea D'Angelo led all scorers with 21 points while Carla Drennan paced WA as she notched 18 points and six boards.

U20 Men: ACT 85 def. Tasmania 84

ACT pushed the game out to a nine-point lead early in the first half but Tre Armstrong [17 points] led the Tassie fightback as they then moved in front by eight points. The game then went back and forth down the stretch with both clubs having an opportunity to seal the win but in the end, Broderick Doran could not be stopped as he recorded an unbelievable 44 points on 15-23 shooting to give ACT a thrilling one-point victory.

Ivor Burge Women: ACT 83 def. Western Australia 29

ACT claimed their first win of 2018 as they controlled the inside with three players recording double-doubles, led by captain Taylor Anderson who stole the show with 22 points. Her opposing captain, Kristy Carter, had a double-double of her own though for WA as she finished with 20 points and 1 rebounds.

U20 Women: South Australia 98 def. Tasmania 57

Tasmania stuck with the South Australians through the opening quarter but after the first break, the Redbacks pulled away as their relentless attack on the offensive glass took its toll. They recorded 35 offensive rebounds with Elissa Brett (15 points, 12 boards) controlling the clash while Tas were led by Jayde Brazendale's 13 points.

U20 Men: NBA Global Academy 81 def. Western Australia 67

In fast-paced contest, the NBA Global Academy's size and strength got the better of WA with Tamuri Wigness controlling proceedings with 20 points while Francisco Caffaro starred with 24 points and ten rebounds in just 19 minutes. Kyle Bowen kept WA in it with 12 points and ten boards but an injury at the end of the third quarter made it too difficult for WA to cause a come from behind victory as they dropped their first game for the tournament.

U20 Women: Queensland 85 def. A.C.T. 63

Queensland set up a top of the table clash with Victoria for Friday morning with a dominating performance against ACT. The women from the nation's capital had a lead early but Qld's continued to drive and attack the rim which garnered rewards for Miela Goodchild (22 points) while they shot 50% from the field as a team. Emma Rowcliffe was exceptional for ACT with 23 points at 76% shooting.

Ivor Burge Women: Japan 65 def. New South 63

This nail-biting contest saw New South Wales dominate inside with Eliza Mills scoring 25 points although they had their fair share of headaches courtesy of Mina Sagawa (20 points, seven assists). Japan took a healthy lead in the final term thanks to their fast-paced offence but NSW were not going down without a fight, closing within a possession in the last minute before the final siren sounded.

Ivor Burge Men: Tasmania 112 def. A.C.T. 73

Joshua Cleary continued his dominance for the Apple Isle, notching a 28-point, 15-rebound double-double but it was his teammate and captain Dylan Pace who set the stadium alight as he tallied a triple-double with 42 points, ten rebounds and ten assists. Justin Koenig battled hard for ACT once again to record 22 points, seven boards and three steals.

Under-20 Men: Victoria 76 def. South Australia 70

South Australia looked set to cause an upset in this game, leading by as much as 17 points but Victoria never lay down, clawing their way back via Owen Hlland who had 18 points at 50%. Keli Leaupepe also played a huge role with 19 points but it was Victoria's bench that took control as they combined to score 31 points and complete the come from behind win.

U20 Women: Victoria 75 def. New South Wales 70

Victoria found themselves trailing for almost the whole second half against NSW as Jasmine Simmons tallied a huge double-double of 30 points and ten rebounds. Victoria picked up their defence late in the fourth term and a couple of turnovers from NSW opened the door with Jaz Shelley recording five steals. That helped to force overtime and Victoria then scored nine unanswered points in the extra period to claim a huge win with Shelley scoring 21 points.

Ivor Burge Men: South Australia 135 def. New South Wales 65

SA put together another stirring performance, cracking the century mark for the second time on Day 3 as six players hit double-double, led by Wayne Kinross' 37 points. Keelan Crawford again paced NSW with 36 points but they did not have the answers for SA inside.

Ivor Burge Men: Victoria 172 def. Western Australia 19

With seven players hitting double-digits in scoring and five scoring 20+, Victoria had their best performance of the tournament as they continued to look like the Championship favourites. WA again struggled to produce on the scoreboard but could not match Victoria's speed in transition.

U20 Men: Queensland 98 def. New South Wales 70

Queensland finished undefeated in Pool B with another comprehensive performance although the final scoreline was not truly indicative of NSW's efforts as they kept the score-line close for most of the game. Sam Froling recorded 22 points and 12 rebounds as he owned the front court while Kody Stattmann hit another game-high with 24 points. For NSW, Jacob Foy nailed 6-8 from beyond the arc while Matt Grey added 19 points.
